

## GRAND PRAIRIE PARTNERS WITH VIA

*City of Grand Prairie rolls out on-demand rideshare | April 12, 2022*

The City of Grand Prairie has teamed up with Via to launch [Via Grand Prairie](#), an on-demand microtransit service that can be booked via app or by phone in Grand Prairie, Texas. After reserving a trip, riders will be directed to a nearby “virtual bus stop,” where they can wait for their ride. During the trip, other riders may be picked up and dropped off. A standard one-way trip costs \$3 (\$2 for seniors), though riders may add an additional passenger to their trip for just \$1 more. This Via-powered service is intended to compliment existing transportation options and expand affordable access to mobility.

## RENO LAUNCHES SCOOTER PROGRAM

*Partnership with Bird for shared micromobility service | April 21, 2022*

The City of Reno and micromobility provider, Bird, have formed a three-year partnership to launch an electric scooter (e-scooter) sharing program in Reno, Nevada. Through this program, Bird will provide and manage a fleet of dockless e-scooters (consisting initially of 250 vehicles and expanding to around 1,000 by mid-June), which will be available for rent in Downtown and Midtown Reno. The Reno City Council hopes that this [E-Scooter Share](#) program will help advance the City of Reno’s Sustainability & Climate Action Plan, as well as increase access to transportation within the community.
