Uber is Metra's official rideshare partner

A marketing partnership between Uber and Chicago's commuter rail agency Anticipated to launch in February, 2017

Metra has announced its three-year agreement with Uber to serve as the agency's official rideshare partner. Metra will receive \$900,000 in exchange for providing Uber with marketing opportunities to communicate to its customer base of 150,000 daily riders. According to Metra, this marketing partnership is the first-of-its-kind and is anticipated to not only generate non-fare revenue but also drive ridership by assisting customers who need a first/last-mile connection. This partnership is a result of Metra's invitation for bids in July.
