#### MTS & LYFT TEAM UP FOR TRANSIT TUESDAY

Partnership for discounted rides to/from select transit stops in San Diego, CA Launched on June 4, 2019 (ends August 27, 2019)

The San Diego Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) has partnered with Lyft to offer discounted, on-demand rides to/from select transit stations on Tuesdays, through their Transit Tuesday initiative. Through this program, the first 500 riders to claim the discount code will be eligible to receive 25% (up to \$3) off up to 26 Lyft rides to/from select transit centers within the designated service area. The rides can be taken between the hours of 6:00am and 7:00pm, any Tuesday from June 4, 2019 to August 27, 2019. The discount can be applied to up to two Lyft trips a day. MTS hopes that, by offering a subsidized option for first/last mile mobility, the Transit Tuesday program will encourage commuters to try transit at least one day a week.

#### **METROLINK PARTNERS FOR MICROTRANSIT**

*Partnership with TransLoc for microtransit service in the Village of Milan, IL Launched on June 10, 2019 (ends January 3, 2020)* 

The Rock Island County Metropolitan Mass Transit District (MetroLINK) has partnered with Ford Smart Mobility company, TransLoc, to launch an ondemand microtransit pilot program. Through this pilot, riders in the Village of Milan can order a 12-passenger, wheelchair accessible van for local curb-tocurb microtransit service. To use the service, riders should download TransLoc's Microtransit app, where they can request rides. Same-day rides can also be requested via phone call. Trips cost \$1 for standard passengers (with discounted rates available for students and designated individuals). The service aims to enhance mobility. It is owned by MetroLINK and will be evaluated based on on-going performance information provided by TransLoc.
