### **DENVER EXPANDS FREE RIDESHARING**

Denver Connector service extends and increases | November 10, 2022

The Denver City Council has voted to extend its free, weekday rideshare service, the <u>Denver Connector</u> – originally a one-year pilot program led by Denver's Department of Transportation and Infrastructure (DOTI) to provide point-to-point, on-demand mobility in Montebello in Denver, Colorado. With this decision, the City and County of Denver will extend service for two more years, as well as expand it to additional neighborhoods. The Denver Connector, operated by DOTI in partnership with Northeast Transportation Connections and Downtowner aims to improve local mobility.

## CARTS ROLLS OUT ON-DEMAND RIDES

Partnership with Via for curb-to-curb microtransit | November 7, 2022

The Capital Area Rural Transportation System (CARTS) has teamed up with Via to launch on-demand microtransit service, <u>CARTS Now</u>, in Marble Falls, Texas. As of November 7, travelers can request a CARTS Now ride between any two points in the Marble Falls area – adding to the existing program service areas in Bastrop, Lockhart, and Taylor, Texas. Service is available Monday through Friday from 7am to 7pm. Rides cost \$2 each way, with discounted rates available for seniors, persons with disabilities, veterans, and children under 12. This service aims to match riders for quick, flexible transportation.
